

Pumpkin Pancakes



Ingredients

- 1 cup mashed pumpkin
- ♦ 1/2 cup flour
- 1 Tbsp sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/4 tsp spice or essence
- 12 tsp baking powder



Instructions

- ♦ Wash, peel and steam the pumpkin

- Fry by dropping spoonfuls into frying pan—make sure that the oil is very hot
