Curried Breadnuts

Love to Cook?

Ingredients

- 1 full (partly ripe) breadnut
- 2 dried coconuts
- 1 Tbsp curry
- **2 Tbsp butter**
- 1 tsp salt (add other seasonings such as thyme and tomato)

Instructions

- Peel Breadnut and divide into natural divisions. ۲
- Boil for 2 hrs then squeeze dry. ٠
- Take out and peel seeds ٠
- Prepare and lightly fry the sesons, add the curry powder, flesh and nuts from the body. ٠
- Make and add about 2 cups of coconut milk, and stew until nuts are soft ٠
- Serve on a hot dish with rice and the grated coconut. ٠
- Decorate with pieces of fried salt fish
